

THE FINALISTS OF THE 2017 "CONTEMPORARY TALENTS"

International Contemporary Art Competition

Ahead of the nomination of the winners of the sixth edition of the "Contemporary Talents" competition, four Expert Committees have chosen the works or projects of **41 finalists** from amongst the **1580 applications received from artists originating from 97 countries.**

The final selection will take place on 17 May 2018 at the meeting of the grand jury to be held in Wattwiller. The choice of prize-winners will be **announced on 18 May at 11:30am at the François Schneider Foundation** by Jean-Noël Jeanneney, president of the grand jury.

The François Schneider Foundation aims to discover, support and introduce new talents to the public, whilst showcasing contemporary art based around the theme of water. Through the "Contemporary Talents" competition he established in 2011, François Schneider supports these artists by acquiring their works and presenting them at the foundation's art centre by means of an exhibition and the publication of a catalogue.

Following the selection of around forty finalists by four expert committees, the grand jury of recognised public figures ine the art and culture sector (Alfred Pacquement, Rosa Maria Malet, Daniel Lelong, Fabrizio Plessi, Roland Wetzel, Ernest Pignon Ernest), choses a maximum of seven prize-winners.

The seven winners each receive 20,000 euros for the acquisition of their work. A total of 160,000 euros is set aside as an aid to production for the realisation of the works presented in project form.

The foundation promotes the artists by means of exhibitions at its art centre, travelling projects, loans of artworks and publications, as well as providing regular updates on their activities.
